

- Provided a variety of learning tools such as lecture videos before class, practice questions in class, lecture notes, outlines of the rules, and practice quiz questions. This repetition was invaluable to my learning and understanding of the material.
- The methodical analysis of how to approach health law is amazing. Professor Pope is uniquely talented in his delivery of information and every week I am amazed at how quickly our class ended because it is so engaging.

- Professor Pope is a top-notch instructor and is among the best teachers I have had (and I say that having earned a number of other degrees before law school). - More writing assignments with hypos to prepare for midterm and final
- I know Professor likes his slides with large font, which I usually also really like. However, sometimes when doing hypos in class, and having the question split up on different slides is hard because I can't remember the beginning of the problem and then its hard for me to get the right answer or think about it because for me, I like to read and re-read a question before I give an answer. Also, sometimes people add too many facts to hypos or start making stuff up that isn't really law related and then I feel like we get off topic for quite a while. This isn't the professors fault, and it is good that people are genuinely interested and have lots of questions they want to ask, but sometimes I think we could move it along a bit faster to make sure we get through all the material.
- The class time was very easily taken over by somewhat random questions and issues outside the scope of the class. It would helpful to restrain those moments so that the majority of the time is spent on material to be covered.
- The quiz and test multiple choice questions could be more clear or instead short answer questions.
- I wish Professor Pope would offer a more advanced version of this class. Perhaps to discuss any number of the topics including EMTALA, ERISA, medical malpractice. I hope the school recognizes the gift they have in Professor Pope. What a treasure and asset to the school!!
- I wouldn't change much. Sometimes Prof. Pope's quiz questions don't make sense or are graded weird, but I didn't mind that much because I still learned a lot.
- The Professor's lecture style was not necessarily conducive to learning. Quiz questions were sometimes open to interpretation which led to difficulty picking the correct answer.
- The exam grading methodology was very transparent and fair. It would be helpful to receive somewhat more substantive comments. I would consider eliminating the pay-for-performance module (my personal opinion is that these governmental programs are constantly changing, and so this particular topic is of low interest and yield for law students). Consider substituting it with end-of-life topics (advanced directives, capacity, surrogate decision-making, etc.), which may be a bit more relevant for budding lawyers.
- 1. Midterm feedback was quite delayed. 2. Rule statements would sometimes vary between pre-recorded lectures, live presentation, and written packets.
