ORDER

This day came Patrick Lawson, in person, *pro se*, the Petitioner, upon a motion for emergency injunction "to stop brain dead test and postpone removal of life support" regarding his two-year-old daughter, named herein, who suffered what is best described as a brain injury on May 11, 2016.

It appearing that the motion is made without notice to the respondent, "MCV Hospital," other than the Petitioner stating to the Court that he advised a physician attending to his daughter that he intended to do "something" to prevent what he describes herein.


Now therefore, the preliminary injunction is **GRANTED** and issued to prevent removal of life support from the said Miranda Grace Lawson, a patient at "MCV Hospital" until **12:00 p.m., May 20, 2016**, at which time this injunction shall expire unless sooner dissolved or enlarged and on the condition that the Petitioner provide notice to "MCV Hospital" of the date and time for any request to extend or enlarge this injunction at a hearing to be had at **12:00 p.m., May 20, 2016**, at the Circuit Court of the City of Richmond, John Marshall Courts Building, Room 304.

The Sheriff shall serve this Order on counsel for VCU Medical Center.


This case is continued generally.
