§ 1. [Determination of Death] A determination of death for an individual shall be made in accordance with currently accepted national medical standards by establishing either:

- (a) the permanent cessation of spontaneous circulatory and respiratory functions,
- or;
- (b) the permanent cessation of spontaneous respiratory functions and the permanent loss of the clinical functions of the brain necessary for consciousness.




