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
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Opioid Epidemic

Increase in overdose deaths in 2018

State Declarations of Opioid Emergencies

- Extend access to naloxone to reduce overdose deaths
- Enhance surveillance and reporting of overdose death
- Mandate Prescription Drug Monitoring Programs by physicians and pharmacists
- Garner federal grants for programs, treatment services, and prevention

Declaration of National Emergency

- July 21, 2017: Presidential Commission recommends declaration of national emergency
- August 10, 2017: Trump states intention to declare national emergency
- October 26, 2017 presents: Declaration of public health emergency; NOT a national emergency



Opioid Litigation



- Beginning stages
- Trials to begin in fall 2019
- Any settlements estimated to be lower than 1998 big tobacco settlements (\$206 billion)




Federal Legislation



- September 17, 2018: Congress passes the Opioid Crisis Response Act of 2018
 - STOP Act
 - o FDA limited packaging
 - Establishes interagency task force
 - Allows Medicaid to pay for residential addiction treatment
 - Allows Medicare to pay for methadone treatment
 - Pay for research for opioid alternatives
 - Authorize funds for a "plan of safe care" for babies born with opioid dependence





Suicide as a Public Health Emergency

- Steady increase in suicide rates
- Highlighted by the public suicides of Kate Spade and Anthony Bourdain

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Gun Violence and Research

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- 2018 omnibus spending bill added language regarding gun research; no change to Dickey language

Violence Against Women Act

- Set to expire Oct. 1, 2018
- Extended until December 7...

Hurricanes Florence, Michael, Maria, Nate: Legal Issues

- Emergency declarations and powers
- Emergency care during crisis (pregnant patients, dialysis patients, emergency patients, surgical patients, etc.)
- Mass torts, etc. from carcinogens, mold...
- Flood insurance
- Property issues
- Federal emergency management agency programs
- Lost jobs
- Food and shelter (CDC)
- Disparate impact, particularly for vulnerable populations
- Maintenance of the rule of law

- 9 states have legalized recreational and medical marijuana
- 21 others have legalized marijuana for medical use only
- November elections:
 - 2 states have ballot initiatives in November that, if passed, would legalize adult marijuana use
 - 2 additional states have ballot initiatives that would legalize medical marijuana

- No steps to legalize at the federal level
- January 2018: AG Sessions rescinds the Cole Memorandum (2013)





- Sept. 12, 2018: FDA Commissioner calls use of ecigarettes by minors an "epidemic"
- Oct. 3: FDA raid of Juul's offices
- 60 day deadline to demonstrate plan to restrict access to minors
- Oct. 12: FDA warning letters to manufacturers



Vaccines

- October 2018: CDC reports rate of non-vaccination has increased from .3% from children born in 2001 to 1.3% for those born in 2015.
- Found "several opportunities for improvement."

Vaccines

- Lawsuit (*Brown v. Smith*) challenged CA's 2015 mandatory vaccination law (SB277), which eliminated personal belief exceptions
- July 2018: California state court upheld the law
 The law did not violate freedom of religion
 The law did not violate right to an education


Workplace Wellness

- 2016 Lawsuit (AARP v. EEOC) alleging that EEOC's workplace wellness regulations alleged that penalty for non-participation makes wellness plans not "voluntary
- Oct. 2018: regulations vacated, as of January 1, 2019

Federal Right to Try

- May 2018: Right to Try law passed
 - "eligible" (terminally ill) patients
 - Drug must have completed Phase I trials
 - No obligation by drug developer to provide access
- Intended to be parallel pathway to FDA's expanded access
